Protect our precious Green Belt - but still provide new homes



No-one wants to build on our Green Belt," says Julie Morris, "but, until recently, the Conservative government had been insisting on it. They gave us an unrealistic housing target and told us that we had to build on the Green Belt if we couldn't achieve their imposed target by other means.

"The Residents' Association controlled council complied meekly with the government's orders and are only now starting to question that position.

"Both parties, Conservatives and Residents' Association, are now running scared of the public backlash at the forthcoming local elections and are changing their stance on the issue.

"Liberal Democrats have never agreed with everything in the Local Plan - you can read our full submission on our website. But we

have strongly supported consulting residents.

"Epsom still needs to build new homes, but we believe the target should be based on the most recent population projections. This would almost halve the number of homes required."

Get serious about climate change and support green initiatives

"It's time this Council got serious about climate change," says James Lawrence. "They don't have a budget for it and there aren't any serious policies for it in the Local Plan.

"Other councils have policies that encourage carbon-neutral development and that allow the council to refuse planning applications that are harmful to the environment. Why haven't policies like these been included in our own Local Plan?

"I'm a car owner, but I also cycle and walk - a lot! Our council should be providing for alternative and greener ways of getting round town. The terrible state of our roads is a real danger for cyclists.

"I support the principle behind ULEZ but it shouldn't hit the poorest people hardest."



Expose Town Hall secrecy and fight for public participation



"I've been shocked by the degree of secrecy in the Town Hall that has been exposed by the FOCUS team" says Julian Freeman. "Some meetings are held in secret and councillors have not been informed when things go wrong.

"The Liberal Democrats have brought these to public attention and have also shamed the Residents' Association into reintroducing some of the opportunities for involving members of the public that the RA themselves had previously scrapped.

"This shows how important it is to have clear and competent opposition who are able to hold the ruling group to account.

"Liberal Democrat councils are way ahead in terms of public engagement and involving residents in local decision-making. We always keep in touch and ask for your views."

STOP PRESS

As we go to print, the council has paused work on our Local Plan. It will now wait for guidance from central government about using Green Belt land in order to meet their housing targets. More work will be undertaken on "brownfield" sites too. The Plan will eventually become a legally binding framework for development in our area up to 2040.

Cllr **Julie Morris** had asked the council to pause work last December after the strength of public opinion against Green Belt development became clear.

Julian FREEMAN


