Overhanging hedges



Are you struggling to walk safely on paths because of the overhanging bushes?

If so, you can contact Surrey County Council to report the issue. The easiest way is to visit the SCC website and search under the roads and transport section.

House owners have a duty to keep their hedges cut back so you can walk safely. If a friendly word cannot persuade your neighbour, then SCC can follow this up on your behalf by writing to them.

When the hedge is on County land, SCC have a duty to carry out the work. The Lib Dems were disappointed to discover, via an FOI request, that locally there is underspend on this budget. The Lib Dems can help you to push the Conservatives to take action!

Lib Dems fight Winter Fuel payment cuts

Liberal Democrats are opposing the Government's cut to Winter Fuel Allowance.

Thousands aged over 80 in Epsom and Ewell are at risk of losing £300 due to the government's cuts.

Cllr Julian Freeman believes that Surrey County Council should be taking a leading role in promoting the support available: "Many pensioners I speak to in Epsom and Ewell are really worried about how they will make ends meet. I am working with Helen and the local Lib Dem team to stand up for our pensioners."

Bikes on Pavements

Motorbikes on pavements have now for a while troubled the residents of Epsom and those of us who walk in the Town centre, particularly by Epsom Square and outside McDonald's.

They park fully on the pavement, obstructing a significant part of the pavement, and occasionally forcing pedestrians out into the road.

Cllr Julian Freeman said, "We recognise the valuable economic benefit that delivery services bring to the area, and how they serve both customers and local businesses, but this must not come at the expense of the right of way of pedestrians. Designated places must be found, such as in dedicated parking bays, and new bays may need to be created. Enforcement action must be taken by Surrey County Council when appropriate."



Pavements should be accessible for all especially those with mobility issues.

Our local Lib Dem MP, Helen Maguire will be meeting with the leader of SCC, Tim Oliver, to push for a solution that finds a legal space for the bikes that is not intimidating and does not obstruct pedestrians on the pavement.

Lib Dems push for new SEND school Lib Dem MPs pressure Conservative County Coucil for placement deferral

Pressure is building to fill the huge gap in Special Educational Needs & Disability (SEND) schooling in the Epsom area with an intervention from newly elected Liberal Democrat MPs.

Epsom & Ewell council has approved the planning application for the change of use for the Karibou Centre on the Wells. The plan is for a new SEND school for 50 pupils. The children would be between 11 and 17 and would receive specialist support for individuals with autistic spectrum disorders.

Lib Dem campaigner Julian Freeman is pleased to see that work appears to have started onsite as Surrey has a shortage of such provision.

In a further development, the six newly elected Surrey Lib Dem MPs are pushing the Conservative County Council to reverse a new decision to give parents a month, rather than six months, to make their placement preferences suggesting that it is an "unacceptably short time frame".
